Leaving Belleville?

If your child is **currently in Reception to Year 5** and you are planning to leave Belleville at the end of this academic year as you are moving home, etc, please come and speak to us about your plans. **You will also need to complete a Leaver's Form** as soon as possible. These are available from the School Offices.

We have children on the waiting list hoping for a place at Belleville from September 2025 and we would like to let their families know whether there is a place available before the summer break.

School Streets – Important Update

Following a period of consultation, Wandsworth Council will be launching an extended scheme for the Belleville Road School Street on **Monday 30 June**. The hours of operation will be **Monday to Friday, 8.20am to 9.10am and 3pm – 4pm, term time only**. The scheme will now **cover the full length of Belleville Road (on both sides of Northcote Road) to serve Bolingbroke Academy as well**.

The scheme **will be enforced with ANPR cameras starting from Monday 30 June**. Exemptions will only be available to those who live on Belleville Road, and those who are Blue Badge/WAND card holders, taxis (private hire), and care workers serving properties within the School Street zone. Emergency vehicles, school buses, black taxis, and utility service vehicles are also eligible for exemption. **If you are in one of these groups, you need to apply for an exemption in advance to avoid receiving a penalty charge notice. You can apply [online via the Council website here](#).**

Meteor Street: We would like to remind parents and carers that the School Street at Meteor Street is still in operation. **Please do not drive into this street** (unless you are a resident or have a Blue Badge/WAND card) during the operating times, **Monday to Friday, 8.20-9.10am and 3.00-3.40pm, term time only**, for the safety of all our children and the residents on the street. If you are exempt and able to use the street during that time, please drive slowly with caution.

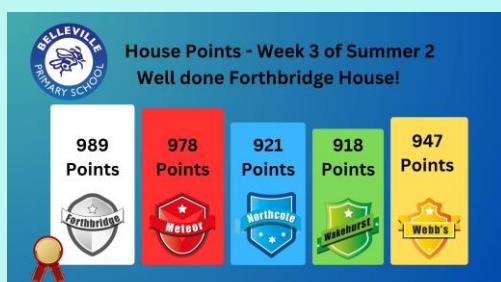

Year 4 have been working so hard in maths this half term. They have been busy exploring area and perimeter using concrete manipulatives. Through hands-on investigations, they have worked together to build shapes, measure sides and deepen their understanding of these key maths concepts.

The children have also enjoyed the start of their new topic 'living things and their habitats'. They used their science enquiry skills to identify, group and classify a range of leaves, carefully observing their shape and features and using an identification key to help them.



French Update
