Year 6 visit to the Black Cultural Archives

This week, 6T had the fantastic opportunity to visit the Black Cultural Archives in Brixton as part of their history learning.

The children explored a range of historical artefacts, photographs, and personal stories that brought the experiences of the Windrush generation to life. They learned about the contributions Caribbean migrants made to British society, as well as the challenges they faced upon arrival. Engaging discussions and activities helped pupils reflect on the importance of diversity, identity, and community in shaping modern Britain.

This visit provided an invaluable experience, reinforcing the historical knowledge gained in class and encouraging thoughtful conversations about resilience, belonging, and cultural heritage.









The Littlest Yak - Primary Arts

Year 5 Update

As the freezing mornings and dark afternoons disappear in our collective rear-view mirrors, replaced by a blanket of bright, warm sunshine, Year 5 have continued to develop their learning, skills and understanding of the world.

In Maths, the pupils are coming to the end of a three-unit exploration of studies of fractions, decimals and percentages. Alongside an in-depth analysis of methods to calculate, covert and compare all three, they have discussed how these skills are transferable to real life scenarios. It was great to see how this knowledge was used when studying the topic of money in our PSCHE lessons.

Our young writers have been working hard on two extended narratives, the first of which was inspired by the events of the incredible novella, "Oranges in No Man's Land". After reading about the journey of the story's protagonist, a ten-year-old girl called Ayesha, across a war-torn city to save her granny, our budding novelists constructed their version of her return journey. Soaked in atmosphere and thrusting action, the ability to create a story of both peril and hope was impressive. Our pupils should feel rightly proud of themselves for creating a truly compelling end to the character's journey (much more compelling than the actual resolution to her journey in the novella itself).

On 6th March, Belleville celebrated World Book Day. In addition to a plethora of costumes and characters, our pupils were introduced to the stunningly beautiful picture book, "Do You Remember?" by Sydney Smith. A book which combines images and text to create an evocative snapshot of childhood, the ambiguities of the text were discussed maturely and articulately by all classes, helped, no doubt, by their three-week unit of lessons in which they analysed picture book techniques.











The topic that launched Geography studies in 2025 for Year 5 was Climate Zones and Biomes. We were fortunate to be joined by the Freshwater Theatre Company and the ensuing workshop, in which the pupils engaged in a range of performance-based activities, all designed to help the children to understand key knowledge and information around the climate zones and biomes of our planet, engaged all of our geographers brilliantly.

Last week was British Science Week. All Year 5 classes embraced the theme, this year, of "Change and Adapt" by taking part in a chemistry lesson that looked at how colour change can help us to identify the PH levels of a range of different solutions. The faces of our young scientists were a picture as they investigated the key questions with a range of equipment chosen to help them understand the difference between acidic and alkaline liquids.
