## Sustainability

As part of the <u>Q1E Trust</u>, we recognise our responsibility to embed sustainability in everything we do. The <u>Q1E Sustainability Vision</u> sets out our ambition to be net zero and climate-ready by 2030 and to provide best-in-class sustainability learning for our children, combined with engagement across the whole school communities that we serve.

The <u>Q1E Sustainability Vision</u> is based on three action areas:

- Decarbonisation and Efficient Resource Use
- Biodiversity and Protecting Nature
- Climate Adaptation and Resilience

So far, we have joined the over 5,200 UK schools signed-up to <u>Let's Go Zero 2030</u>, and joined <u>Education Nature Park</u>. We are registered with <u>EnergySparks</u> to enable us to monitor and then start to reduce our energy usage. We will be starting food waste recycling next month, in addition to the paper and pen recycling already undertaken by our Eco-Council.

# Year 6 Update

Year 6 have continued to impress with their deep thinking and enthusiasm for a challenge. In Science, to enrich their learning on the circulatory system, the children dissected a lamb's heart. The children's questioning and understanding of what they observed was very impressive as they identified the blood vessels present, the impact of fat on the function of the heart and the importance of valves within the heart.



In History, the children had a presentation by Dr Eiad Zinah, a dentist from Syria. We heard all about his journey and the challenges he has faced in getting to where he is now. To further enrich our History learning, the children will soon be going to the Black Cultural Archives in Brixton, to develop their understanding of the Windrush generation.

The children thoroughly enjoyed their Computing unit this half term, where they programmed Sphero RVR+ robots to complete a range of tasks. Problem solving skills were key to this as they learnt to debug their code.

Our English learning this half term has been based upon the Graphic Novel 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan. Using this book as inspiration, the children have written a number of pieces: a diary entry, learning to empathise with a character; a letter, developing their ability to change the register of their writing; a narrative, focusing on building tension; and our favourite, a persuasive advert and subsequent onestar review, where the children tried to convince someone to visit their fictional city before picking apart the limitations of the city they had created.

# Year 1

In Year 1, we are learning about the five animal classes. This week, the children were scientists making observations and comparing two fish: a rainbow trout and a mackerel. They identified the gills, fins, eyes, mouth, tail and scales, and touched the scales to feel if they were smooth or rough, dry or moist. It was fintastic!





## Year 3 Visit the British Museum

Our Year 3 classes have visited the British Museum to enrich their learning about the Ancient Egyptians. They listened to a presentation about how the Ancient Egyptians mummified bodies and then went to see the real-life artefacts in the museum. It was amazing to see the size of the items and how elaborate they were in real life.
