What to do if there's a problem and parent/carer conduct expectations

We do understand that when you are worried about your child or something that is happening in school it can be an emotional and difficult time for you as parents/carers.

Our staff are available to listen to you and to help as much as we can by working as partners together.

On (thankfully) rare occasions, we have needed to remind parent/carers about our expectations of their own conduct, communication and behaviour at school.

We ask that you remember to:

- never confront someone else's child about an issue either on site or in the local area let school know and let us handle the problem.
- avoid conflict/confrontation with other parents/carers at school this makes children feel unsafe. Staff are on hand to hear any concerns.
- treat our staff politely we may need to end conversations that are aggressive, demeaning or discriminatory.
- be careful about what you post on chat groups or similar negative/personal comments about staff or children are rarely useful in resolving issues but usually do cause significant upset.
