We hope that you and your family are well. We are writing to you as someone who has received the offer of a place at Belleville School from Wandsworth Council yesterday evening. We very much hope that you will choose to accept your place.

This newsletter gives you a brief overview of what our children have been up to during the Spring term. Should you choose to join us, we will provide you with further information about how we help your child with the transition to primary school, all the information you will need for their first day, and events you can attend to meet other new parents/carers over the coming months.

For those of you who choose to accept your place, we will be back in contact with you in the coming weeks to ask you about your preference for school site, Webb's Road or Meteor Street. We are one school with two sites and in September 2026, we will have three Reception classes at Webb's Road and two at Meteor Street. The allocation of sites also follows the order in our [admissions criteria](#).

We also wanted to let you know that we provide our own wraparound care at both sites, which runs from 7.30am until the start of the school day and after-school from 3.20pm to 6.30pm. If you accept your place, we will send you more information about how to sign up for this during the summer term.

Spring Term at Belleville Primary School

In sport, some of our older children have taken part in competitions in athletics, football, and netball. We are very proud of our girls' football team who came 2nd out of 97 teams in the regional finals of the Premier League's Primary Stars. Year 5 have been enjoying swimming lessons and our younger children have been developing their ball skills, gymnastics and dance with our specialist teachers.



In music, our Year 6 children performed at Fairfield Halls as part of Wandsworth Music's Brighter Sound concert, our School Orchestra played at the Mayor's Gala Concert, and our School Choir performed as part of Wandsworth's London Borough of Culture celebrations. All our Year 4 children have continued to learn an orchestral instrument with Wandsworth Music. With our specialist art teachers, the children have been studying the work of Carle, Picasso and Modigliani. In French, our Year 5 and 6 pupils have taken part in the National Routes into Languages French Bee. In maths, three children made it to the prestigious bonus round of the UK's Primary Maths Challenge.

In Reception, our children have been learning Traditional Tales and took part in a drama workshop with West End in Schools based on the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. In English, they are beginning to write in full sentences and use more complex language. In maths, we have been cementing the children's understanding of counting forwards and backwards, ordering numbers and knowing number bonds to ten, as well as doubling and halving of numbers. In science, the children became palaeontologists for a day when they took part in a dinosaur workshop.



Groups of children have visited Battersea Fire Station, Black Cultural Archives, Clapham Common Bandstand Beds, Florence Nightingale Museum, National History Museum, Science Museum and local churches. A group of our Year 6 children had the amazing opportunity to visit Downing Street. We have had talks from a doctor and police officer, and workshops by Build to Learn Lego and ZooLab. We have raised funds for Red Nose Day and our partner schools in Ghana, as well as celebrating British Science Week, with a school-wide experiments on the theme of 'Curiosity: What's Your Question?', World Book Day, and British Neurodiversity Week.

To support our parents and carers, we offer open classrooms where you can come in and see your child's work, as well as a variety of events around children's wellbeing and learning. We hosted many social and fundraising events organised by our very supportive PTA community – this term we enjoyed bake sales and school discos, and next term is our Summer Fair. The school and the children have been very busy! We do hope you will choose Belleville and your child will join in the fun next year.
