Secondary Transfer into Year 7 2020

Dear Parents/Carers of Children in Year 5,

As you may be aware, the secondary transfer process starts in the summer term of Year 5 with open days. Please find below more information about dates and support for you and your child.

Application Forms

At the start of Year 6 your child will be given two booklets with information about secondary schools; one for the state schools and one for local independent (private) schools. This will have key information about admissions criteria and how to make applications. The booklets for this year are on the school website to give you an idea of the information you will receive.

You can make applications online or using a paper copy from September 2019 but we recommend that you visit schools and get the results of the Wandsworth tests before deciding which schools and in which order you would like to put them on your form.

The application must be received by Wandsworth (or your local borough if you are not a Wandsworth resident) by 31st October 2019 - it is very important that you do not miss this date.

Open Days

We encourage parents/carers to visit as many schools as possible, ideally during the school day and with your child. Secondary schools are holding open days this term and will have open day events in the first half term of Year 6 – a leaflet with open day dates for Wandsworth state schools is being sent with this letter. You may find it useful to visit schools more than once i.e. in the summer and autumn terms.

If you are visiting a school during the day with your child, we ask that whenever it is possible you register them and then sign them back out to keep their attendance rate up.

Wandsworth Tests

The Wandsworth Tests (Verbal and Non-Verbal Reasoning) are taken in the third week of September. They are taken at Belleville in your child's classroom during the school day. You do not need to register your child for the tests as all children in Wandsworth Schools (and therefore at Belleville) have to take the tests.

All children have to take the tests in case you decide to apply for a school that uses it for selective places or banding. The exception to this is that children with a Statement or Education and Healthcare Plan (EHCP) for Special Educational Needs do not need to sit the tests as their secondary schools are chosen in their plans.

The test was moved from November to September in the 2016-17 academic year. This is so you can have the result of the test before the deadline to apply for the schools as the test result may show whether your child is likely to be given a selective place (i.e. because of a high score).

From our tracking over the three years that the tests have been taken in September, it has not ended up with lower tests scores than when the children took it in November. This is because all children now take it in September (and they are compared against each other) and at Belleville we have moved our test preparation to happen earlier in Year 5 and Year 6.

Test results are used to give a number of selective places (places purely based on the highest test scores) at the following schools:

- Graveney (mixed),
- Ernest Bevin (boys),
- Burntwood (girls).

All of these schools also offer places that are not linked to test scores e.g. for special needs, siblings and distance.

All other Wandsworth schools either do not use test results at all to give places (e.g. Bolingbroke), or use it for banding and then give places to children with siblings, closest distance within each band (e.g. Ashcroft).

Getting a very high score in the tests is therefore only important if you are going to apply for Graveney, Ernest Bevin or Burntwood and you do not live nearby/have a sibling at the school etc. so will need to get a selective (high test score) place.

Children will do paired practice of Verbal and Non-Verbal tests during lessons in Year 5 this term. At the start of Year 6 they will do some more paired practice and also do a timed practice of each test. We offer this practice to every child so they are familiar with the types of questions, how to fill out their answers and so they can hopefully feel confident to do their best.

There are many practice materials you can use at home available from bookshops/online e.g. www.cgpbooks.co.uk, Bonds tests are all useful practice. The closest in format to the Wandsworth Test is produced by GL Assessment – look for ‘Multiple Choice Verbal Reasoning’ and ‘Multiple Choice Non-Verbal Reasoning’.

Specialist places in Wandsworth Schools

Some schools offer a number of specialist places and you need to complete a supplementary information form (SIF) before the October deadline as below:

School	Specialist Places	Return SIF by
Ashcroft	24 places for Technology (DT and ICT)	13 th September 2019
Chestnut Grove	30 places for Art and Design	6 th September 2019
	30 places for Modern Foreign Languages	
Saint Cecilia's	15 places for Music, 7 of which are open to any faith	13 th September 2019

If you want to apply for a specialist place your child will also have to complete additional assessments. The leaflet attached has dates of the extra assessments for these places and the individual school websites have further details on specialist places.

Schools in other boroughs

You may wish to look at schools in nearby boroughs e.g. Lambeth, Kensington and Chelsea, Merton, Croydon, Sutton. Please check the websites for these councils to find out information about open days and any testing arrangements (Wandsworth Test results are only used to allocate places in Wandsworth state schools). You can apply for state schools in any London borough on the same form.

Grammar Schools (fully selective schools)

If you are interested in the Sutton Grammar schools (Greenshaw High School, Nonsuch High School for Girls, Sutton Grammar School, Wallington County Grammar School, Wallington High School for Girls and Wilson's School), you will need to register your child between now and 16th August 2019. The Selective Eligibility Test takes place on 17th September 2019.

For Tiffin School (boys) and The Tiffin Girls' School in Kingston you will need to register your child between 10th June and 18th July with the first stage of tests on the 1st October.

Independent Schools

Children from Belleville apply to and are given places and scholarships in a range of independent (fee-paying, private) schools. Please see the Belleville website for the Independent Schools Information pack which has useful information on admissions for independent schools and the Secondary Destinations information.

Please note – unlike with state applications where you are offered one school at a time, a child can be offered multiple independent schools at once. This means that the 'number of offers' and 'places taken' can be very different e.g. 2016 Alleyn's 12 children were offered places but 2 accepted the place – the other 10 children went to a different independent school or took their state school offer.

Belleville Website

Please visit the school website www.belleville-school.org.uk which has lots of information on where Belleville children transfer to, open days, typical interview questions, scholarships etc. Choose the section 'Our School' and there is a tab for secondary transfer. We will also send you any additional information via the school app and email when we receive this.
