School Admissions – The Legal Basics

- Right to express a preference
- Number of places available
- Fewer applications than places
- More applications than places
- Published admission criteria
- Right to appeal if place refused
- Responsibility to arrange a place

Types of school


Different types and status of school:

- Community Schools
- Voluntary Aided Schools
- Academies
- Foundation Schools
- Free Schools

Also independent schools (private) schools. Usually have to pay fees. Outside of state school admissions process.

Collecting information

- Investigate which would be the best school for your child.
- Secondary School Admissions Brochures & School Prospectuses & Websites, Ofsted Reports, Internet
- Attend the special open days/evenings VISIT THE SCHOOL
- Discuss the transfer with your child's primary school teacher or headteacher
- Look at the admission criteria and previous years' admissions to see how likely you are to be offered a place
- Visit www.wandsworth.gov.uk/admissions or www.eadmissions.org.uk for information about schools in your area and elsewhere
- Information about schools in other boroughs in other council's brochures and websites and school websites.
- Can your child realistically travel to the school?



Oversubscription criteria that schools use

Non Selective Places

- Children in Public Care (or adopted from care)
- Siblings (brothers or sisters on roll at time of application)
- Distance (straight line from home to centre of school site)
- Exceptional Medical/Social Needs (professionally supported)
- Church Attendance (Church of England & Catholic Schools)
- Feeder primary schools (Bolingbroke Academy only)

Banding (An equal spread of ability)

 Children divided into 5 equal groups based on test scores -Ashcroft & Chestnut Grove

Selective Places

- General Ability (Highest test scores) Burntwood & Graveney
- Subject Aptitude (Tests in Art, Languages, Music, Technology)
- Ashcroft, Chestnut Grove & St Cecilia's.



The chances of getting a place

- What are the admission criteria?
- How many places?
- How many applications were there last year?
- How many were admitted under each criterion?
- Up to what distance from the school were places offered last year?
- Information for last year within admission brochure and previous four years available online



The Pan-London Admissions Process

Why introduced?

- Complexity of admissions process in London
- This year over 90,000 students transferred to secondary school in London
- Over 60% applicants apply for schools in other boroughs – nearly 89,000 preferences were expressed for schools and academies in other boroughs
- Introduced to eliminate the multiple offer of maintained school and academy places to parents in London and thereby increase the number of parents offered a place at the initial offer stage



Key Features of the Pan-London Admissions Process

- Single application form to the council in which you live
- Apply for up to 6 schools in any borough
- Rank the schools in the order you prefer them
- Applications for schools in other boroughs are passed to other councils
- Schools consider applications separately using their criteria
- Schools tell the local council whether they can allocate a place
- If a child can be allocated a place at more than one school, the council will offer whichever of these the parent listed highest
- Information is exchanged between councils
- School offered is whichever one the parent ranked highest of those able to make an offer
- Single notification from 'home' council sent on 3 March



Benefits of the Pan-London admissions process

- Easier for parents to apply on one form
- Helpful to parents to receive the outcome on the same day
- Because nobody is offered more than one school, more parents are offered one of their chosen schools at the outset
- Across London, 94% applicants offered a preferred school on the initial offer day in 2024. There have been fewer appeals since the system was introduced 20 years ago.



How to apply

Apply online - visit www.eadmissions.org.uk or www.wandsworth.gov.uk/admissions

OR

Alternatively, you can use a paper form available from Pupil Services.

If you live outside Wandsworth you must apply through your home Local Authority.

We strongly encourage you to apply online



Benefits of online application

- Secure and confidential only your council's school admission team will see your whole application
- Straightforward to register
- Follow the simple instructions on screen to complete and submit form. Tips and prompts as you complete the form.
- You can use the system 24 hours a day/7 days a week
- You can save your form and log back in later to finish or make changes
- Attach supporting documents
- Email reminders to submit your form and
- When you submit your form, it will automatically be sent to the right place and acknowledged by email. Cannot be lost or delayed in post
- You can print a copy of your form
- You receive an email with the outcome during the evening of 1
 March
- 99.2% London parents applied online last year.



Completing the application

Child and Parent Details

- Your child's only permanent address
- Children in public care or previously in public care
- Children with an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) apply through separate process

School Preferences

- List up to 6 state schools in any area
- List them in order of preference
- Preference order decides between two or more offers of a place

Siblings (brothers or sisters)

- Must still be attending the school when the child starts.

Medical/Social Reasons

- Must provide professional evidence why <u>essential</u> for child to go to this school in particular. (Some schools do not have this criterion)



Listing School Preferences

- Remember you can apply for up to 6 state schools in any area
- Read the criteria and how places were allocated last year
- We recommend you apply for at least four schools
- Include at least one local school
- Make sure you list the schools in your genuine order of preference (cannot be changed after the closing date)



Faith schools

If you are considering applying for a school place on faith grounds, it is important you complete the school's **Supplementary Information Form (SIF)**

- St Cecilia's (Foundation Place)
 Complete the Foundation place form (the SIF)
- St John Bosco
 Complete the Catholic school religious affiliation form (the SIF)
- Faith schools in other boroughs Check with borough or school if a SIF is required
- For these schools must include school in list of preferences AND complete supplementary information form (SIF)
- Return SIF direct to school



Specialist Aptitude Places in Wandsworth Schools

Applications for specialist aptitude places
 Art & Design - 30 places at Chestnut Grove
 Academy

Modern Languages - 30 places at Chestnut Grove Academy

Music - 18 places at St Cecilia's School

Technology – 24 places at Ashcroft Technology College



Specialist Aptitude Places in Wandsworth Schools (2)

 If you wish to be considered you must complete the school's supplementary information form (SIF) and return SIF to the school direct by the date below.

School	SIF deadline	Date of test
IACAGEMY - Up to 74	Return the SIF by 30 September 2024	14 and 15 October 2024
- up to 30 specialist places	Complete the SIF on the school's website by midday on 6 September 2024	14 September 2024
	Return the SIF by 8 October 2024	Preliminary assessment 18 October 2024 and final assessment 24 October 2024

- You will be advised of the test results before the main closing date for applications (31 October).
- This will enable you to assess whether to proceed with application for a specialist aptitude place. If you do, you must list the school as a preference on your online application or Common Application Form.



Submitting your application

- The closing date for applications is Tuesday 31 October.
- Online applications must be submitted by midnight on 31 October
- Paper forms from Wandsworth residents must be received by Pupil Services at Wandsworth Council by 31 October.
- Non-Wandsworth residents must return their application to the council in which they live.
- SIFs must be returned directly to the school.
- Applications for schools outside Wandsworth will automatically be passed to other councils
- All applications will be acknowledged.



Wandsworth Year 6 Test (1)

Timing of the Test

- The Wandsworth Year 6 admissions test will be in September 2024 for children starting secondary school in 2025.
- Requirement of the national admissions code and will help you to assess whether your child may be eligible for a selective (ability) place at Burntwood School or Graveney School before making an application.
- You must ensure that your child can take the test on the set date.
 Only in exceptional circumstances will there be an opportunity to take the test on another day.

Registration

You must register your child for the test if:

- You are considering applying for a place at Ashcroft Technology Academy, Burntwood School, Chestnut Grove Academy Graveney School.
- Register online at www.wandsworth.gov.uk/admissions by 4 September 2024.
- If you are not considering applying for one of these schools, there is no need to register or for your child to take the test.



Wandsworth Year 6 Test (2)

When and where the test is taken

- The test will be held over three days during term time Thursday 26 September, Friday 27 September and Monday 30 September 2024.
- All children registered will sit the test at one of the secondary school test venues on one of the these dates.
- Invitation details will be sent by email on 13 September 2024.
- If a child is absent
- What the test involves
 - Non Verbal Reasoning and Verbal Reasoning

How results are used

- Selective places (Burntwood [60 places] and Graveney
 [70]) offered to those applicants achieving test score.
- Ability bands (Ashcroft, Chestnut Grove). if you are considering applying for Ashcroft or Chestnut Grove, your child must sit the Year 6 admissions test. Without this, the school(s) will not be able to place your child in an ability band.



Wandsworth Year 6 Test (3)

Results

- You will be notified of your child's test results by 23 October. The notification will provide information about:
 - how the test scores are used by the schools
 - previous years' admissions selective places, and
 - ability bands at Wandsworth schools.
- This will help you to assess whether your child may be eligible for a selective (ability) place at Burntwood School or Graveney School before making an application. It will also be a guide as to which ability band your child may be placed in if you apply for Ashcroft Technology Academy or Chestnut Grove Academy.
- Each school has its own admission criteria. Schools may use the test scores in different ways when allocating places or may not use them at all.
- A score that results in an offer of a place at one school will not necessary result in an offer at another.

Other tests

- Subject aptitude tests <u>if</u> you apply for specialist place
- Selective schools in other boroughs have their own test



How the system works





How places are allocated

- Schools consider your application separately using their criteria
- Your preference rankings are not revealed
- Schools tell their council if they can allocate your child a place
- If your child can be allocated a place at more than one school, the council will offer you whichever of these you ranked highest
- If your child can be allocated a place at a school in more than one borough, the councils will exchange information and offer you whichever of these you ranked highest
- Any lower ranked school places will be re-allocated to other children



How places are allocated

5th Bolingbroke Academy	Yes	Withdrawn as higher preference met
6th Harris Battersea Academy	Yes	Withdrawn as higher preference met



Receiving the decision





National Offer Day - One Notification on 3 March 2025

- Email sent to online applicants during the evening of 3 March via London Eadmissions Team
- Paper applicants emailed notification on evening of 1
 March. If no email address posted outcome letter
 posted by first class mail on 3 March by the council in
 whose area you live.
- Online applicants offered a lower preference or alternative school also sent a more detailed email notification direct from the Council.
- Outcome of each preference
- Offer of place (highest preference possible)
- Alternative offer (if no preference offered)
- Where to get further details
- How and when to appeal
- How to accept the place offered



What to do next

- Accept the place offered unless you have a definite place elsewhere
- Your child will be placed on the waiting list for any schools which are a higher preference than the school offered
- If a higher preference school becomes available later we will let you know
- Your child's position on the waiting list can move up or down
- You can appeal if you are refused a place at a higher preference school
- If none of the schools you applied for can offer a place on 1 March, we will offer a place at the nearest school with a vacancy. You can also make further applications.



Independent Appeals Process

- If not offered your preferred school, you have right of appeal to an independent appeal panel
- Panel will have no connection with the school or LA
 made of lay people and people with experience of education
- Their role is to consider any exceptional reasons to attend the school that you may highlight and weight this against the school's reason for refusing admission
- Have discretion to uphold your appeal and instruct the school to admit your child over the school's admission number.
- Appeals heard May-July.
- No guarantee appeal will be successful nationally for 2022 admissions, 20.9% of secondary school admission appeals were upheld.

- September October : Meeting your child's primary Headteacher or class teacher to discuss transfer
- 4 September closing date for Year 6 Test registration
- 6 September closing date for Chestnut Grove specialist place SIF
- 14 September Chestnut Grove specialist place assessments
- 30 September closing date for Ashcroft specialist place SIF
- 26, 27 & 30 September Year 6 test held in four secondary school venues
- 8 October closing date for St Cecilia's specialist place SIF
- 18 and 24 October St Cecilia's music aptitude assessments
- 14 and 15 October

 Ashcroft specialist aptitude test
- 31 October Closing date for applications
- 3 March Online applicants receive email
- 3 March Your council posts outcome letter by first class mail
- 4 March Paper applicants receive outcome letter if no email.
- May-July Appeals heard
