This will include immersing children in the work of illustrator and author Christian Robinson, reading a range of wonderful and inspirational books, sharing stories and learning new skills.


About Christian Robinson

Christian Robinson is one of the most distinguished illustrators currently working in children's books. He is the recipient of multiple awards and nominations for his work.



Growing up in a small one-bedroom apartment with his brother, two cousins, aunt, and grandmother, he drew as a way to make space for himself and to create the kind of world he wanted to see; his picture book illustrations reflect a diverse community in the context of books that tackle 'big topics' (as described by one of his collaborators, Matt de la Peña) and foster empathy in readers.

He worked for Pixar Animation Studios before becoming an illustrator of books for children. His books include the #1 New York Times bestseller Last Stop on Market Street, written by Matt de la Peña, which was awarded a Caldecott Honor, a Coretta Scott King Illustrator Honor, and the Newbery Medal.



We are very excited to have chosen You Matter, Christian Robinson's debut as an author-illustrator, as our book for World Book Day 2021; it was featured in the New York Times' Children's Books of the Year in 2020.

Every classroom will have copies of this book in their class libraries to enjoy long after this date.

The week will culminate in children creating a piece of work inspired by what they've read, using the skills they've learned during the week which children will share together when everyone returns on Monday 8th March. More details will follow in the weekly home learning plan.
