

Alley's offers co-educational excellence in an inclusive and caring community for boys and girls aged 11 to 18. We are academically selective and provide a broad education. We welcome our pupils from a variety of state and independent schools, and from a host of different backgrounds. One third of our intake at 11+ is from our Junior School.

Alley's pupils are collaborative learners who consistently achieve high standards. They are polite, articulate, and most importantly happy. Exam results are consistently outstanding at both GCSE and A level. The vast majority of our leavers move on to top university courses and specialist centres of learning for a wide range of disciplines such as music, veterinary sciences, the arts and medicine.

Alley's is known for its excellent pastoral care and for encouraging pupils to engage in the widest possible range of co-curricular activities. Our co-curricular provision includes numerous clubs and societies, volunteering and outreach, as well as CCF and one of the largest Duke of Edinburgh programmes in the south-east of England.

Our 28-acre campus features superb facilities for science, music, art and drama. These include the R.V. Jones Science Building, complete with cloud chamber and rooftop observatory, the RIBA award-winning MCT theatre, the admirably equipped Hooper Music School and a state-of-the-art, RIBA London award-winning Lower School building that is the dedicated home for our Year 7 and Year 8 pupils.

Sport and games are an important part of life at Alley's, with pupils enjoying football, netball, hockey, cricket, basketball, fives, swimming, water polo and athletics, among other activities. Pupils appreciate our well-maintained sports fields, cricket grounds, tennis courts, multi-use games area (MUGA) and AstroTurf pitch, as well as our swimming pool complex with a viewing gallery and Olympic standard timing system.

Means-tested bursaries of up to 100% are available and we are keen to offer places to academically able children who might flourish here but whose family is unable to meet the fees. Our registration fee is waived for those who qualify for Pupil Premium.

Dulwich College



Dulwich College offers a caring, supportive and well-ordered environment in which boys from a variety of cultural and social backgrounds can feel secure and equally valued. The College is academically selective and welcomes pupils into Year 7, Year 9 and Year 12 from a wide range of schools from both the maintained and independent sectors.

Founded in 1619, Dulwich benefits from historic buildings surrounded by 70 acres of well-kept grounds and sports fields. The College has some of the best facilities in the area and a long tradition of academic, cultural and sporting success. A level results now show more than 90% of results regularly at A*, A, B grades. Nearly all leavers progress to degree courses at top universities with more than one in ten going to Oxbridge.

Each pupil at Dulwich is provided with an appropriate academic challenge to allow all boys to achieve their potential, whilst a huge range of co-curricular activities and clubs and societies inspire students to develop valuable skills of team work and leadership.

Music and Drama flourish at Dulwich and many gifted musicians are attracted by the high standards and excellent facilities. Dramatic productions at all levels of the school are regularly staged in the College's own Edward Alleyn Theatre. In addition to rugby, football, hockey and cricket, more than 20 sports are regularly played at Dulwich and all pupils are encouraged to find a sport and develop a breadth of interests which will harness their enthusiasm and talents.

Dulwich College offers a significant number of bursaries each year and warmly welcomes applications from boys who are intellectually curious and enthusiastic to stretch themselves to their limits. No distinction is made at Dulwich between those boys in receipt of financial assistance and those not; the aim is educational excellence irrespective of background or circumstance and the College celebrates this diversity and the benefits it brings to the community.

Emanuel School

Eight minutes' walk from Clapham Junction in a green oasis, Emanuel School is going from strength to strength.

The independent school has risen almost 100 places to enter the top 100 schools for combined GCSE and A level outcomes in *The Sunday Times Parent Power* tables (2019).

As a fully co-educational school, Emanuel also sits within the top 50 schools for girls and boys.

Beyond the classroom, pupils are encouraged to take an active part in daily co-curricular life, with over 60 clubs and societies and a wealth of opportunities in art, music, drama and sport. Pupils thrive in this busy environment, growing in confidence and achieving places at institutions from Cambridge to RADA. Former pupils have pursued a vast range of exciting careers, including artists and award-winning novelists, actors and screenwriters for the BBC and Netflix, singer-songwriters, leading medics, lawyers and entrepreneurs, including the founder of the World Wide Web.

Emanuel is building on its long-established relationships with the local community. Boys and girls of all ages work collaboratively with local state schools on enrichment projects and fundraise for charitable causes. Last September, Emanuel launched its new 'Primary Ambitions' partnership with 22 local primary schools. Every Friday afternoon, sixth formers mentor primary pupils in the arts, academic subjects and sport – a valuable cross-sector relationship, using the school's facilities, involving 96 Emanuel pupils and over 500 primary pupils.

Emanuel remains committed to free places; since the Fully Funded Places project began in 2016, 31 pupils have been educated on a free place and we aim to provide 43 pupils with a transformational free place before 2024. In September 2020, three students are joining the Sixth Form on Battersea Rise Trust Awards: means-tested, fully funded places granted to students of exceptional academic ability from lower income families. We aim to offer at least one of these awards to 16+ applicants in the coming years.

JAGS' splendid 22-acre site in Dulwich provides excellent facilities, including a new music centre, sports centre with indoor swimming pool, dance studios, artificial turf pitches, Sixth Form centre, large library, modern languages laboratories, 13 science laboratories, botany gardens, purpose built theatre and drama studio.

Renowned for academic achievements at both GCSE and A-level, JAGS also has a rich array of extra-curricular activities. Girls' sporting and artistic talents are valued and developed. Pupils' stunning artwork is on display, as are photos of regular productions staged in our Prissian Theatre. Music is another great strength with 6 school choirs, 4 orchestras and numerous ensembles and groups; everyone is encouraged to sing or play. St Paul's School



St Paul's School is for gifted boys aged 7-18 who are enthusiastic and curious learners with an interest in following an outstanding academic curriculum. Set within 45 acres alongside the Thames, St Paul's has unrivalled facilities for a London day school.

Sport facilities include: five cricket pitches, a 4G pitch, eleven rugby and football pitches, swimming pool, a dojo, fencing hall, courts for rackets, squash and fives, and its own boathouse for dedicated rowers.

Other facilities include a state-of -the-art music hall; a West End style theatre, named after notable alumnus Samuel Pepys; an art department spanning over three floors; a multi award winning science block; and an enviable engineering and technology suite. The school's aim is to provide a rich, stimulating and supportive environment in which bright boys, from all backgrounds, are able to discover and develop their full potential to grow into rounded, unique individuals, who make a positive contribution to society.

St Paul's Juniors, housed separately within the extensive grounds, is where the younger boys aged 7-13 enjoy a nurturing environment, reaping the benefits of sharing superb facilities, with the highest possible quality of teaching and pastoral care.

The ages of entry to St Paul's Juniors is 7+, 8+ and 11+. Entry is selective, but is designed to ensure the boys entering the school will be happy and fulfilled. The pace of life is fast, but fun all the way. Enjoyment is key to learning and St Paul's School offers a wealth of opportunities to keep boys engaged and excited.

Bursaries - Assistance with Fees

St Paul's takes great pride in being able to offer financial assistance to the families of talented boys who otherwise could not afford private education. St Paul's School offers a generous number of part and full bursaries each year for those on a household income of less than £120,000. The level of financial assistance is dependent on circumstances and is subject to annual means testing. Bursary provision continues each year until the pupil completes his education at St Paul's School.

As we begin our third decade, we are increasingly aware that young people require an education that prepares them to navigate life successfully. Although academic rigour is foundational for us at Thames, we are passionate about seeing young people understand their value and learn to contribute to the wider community.

Small classes and excellent pastoral care enable us to challenge and support each individual in their learning and in building good interpersonal skills. Our ethos of compassion, respect and humility enables young people to grow in confidence and in their appreciation of each other.

We look forward to moving into our new building adjacent to Clapham Junction in September 2021. We anticipate a richer curriculum in a purpose-built facility that includes multiple science laboratories, art, DT and textiles studios, food technology room, theatre, dance/drama studio, music facilities, library, a sixth form centre and use of an adjoining multi-use games area. However it will be our ethos and values that will continue to define us, not our building.

Pupils are encouraged to keep their options open, taking a broad combination of GCSEs including separate sciences, arts subjects, languages and humanities. Pupils pursue subjects that develop their skills and aspirations, attaining qualifications that open doors to future career choices.
